On the Waterfront in 2021

The Power Plant site was sold in 2020! Moving on in 2021...

NOTICe will advocate to implement the key tenets of the Old Town North Small Area Plan (OTN SAP): protecting our waterfront trails, views and access; pedestrian friendly design and green streets, expanded tree canopy and 8 acres of new public green space, more affordable housing, bringing art to our Arts Corridor and preserving the last remnants of North Old Town history – Slaters Lane and the W&OD Railroad. We also urgently need broadband infrastructure and a safe bicycle route from the Mt Vernon Trail along East Abingdon Street between Bashford and Slaters Lanes to keep our neighborhood safe and connected. **Eleanor Quigley** of Alexandria House, also on the ALX Beautification Commission, is leading NOTICe tree canopy campaign.

NOTICe will keep you up to date on public safety issues as well as Waterfront construction activity at Oronoco Bay Park with two new representatives on the River Renew Stakeholder Group: **Erik Olson** from Watergate of Alexandria and **Mace Carpenter** from Rivergate. **Agnes Artemel** and our UDAC reps, **Tom Soapes** and **Katherine Bingler** will keep us on top of zoning, plans and designs for new developments along Tide Lock Park and Mt Vernon Trail, including Trans Potomac Plaza and the former Gen-On Power Plant.

NOTICe will actively engage in the planning process this year to tear down and reimagine the old Gen-On (Mirant) Power Plant site- the last 20+ industrial acres to be redeveloped in our neighborhood. Innovation and Green are the key words here. NOTICe worked more than a decade with our City leaders (shout out to retiring **Councilwoman Del Pepper**) to close this plant and guide the OTN SAP. We have a lot of skin in the game. **Christa Watters**, former NOTICe President, now on the Waterfront Commission, will keep us informed of the goals of the Small Area plan for this waterfront site. NOTICe worked with the City of Alexandria and the developers of The Gables to find a mutually agreed upon location for a new Bikeshare location in our neighborhood.
